

*Pot washing on the 1st day of June 1996.*

Unlike the day of the field walk, pot- washing was rather chilly and. in spite of working in Skinner's tithe barn (reputedly) at Glebe Cottage, Camerton, 10 members needed regular top-ups of warm water to keep fingers nimble whilst scrubbing field walk finds with old tooth brushes.
