THE THIRD ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING WAS HELD AT THE  
TECHNICAL COLLEGE ON NOVEMBER 30th. 1951.

After the Minutes had been read and approved, the Director of Excavations read his report on the year's work. Many difficulties had been encountered, he said, in the excavation of the Bath City Wall. No sign of Roman foundations had been found at the point chosen, but when the sorting and tabulating of pottery was complete, there should be some valuable dating material.

At Camerton useful work had been continued after the Bath dig.

Mrs. Parfitt and those who had helped with the research work at the Library and the Archaeological Survey work were thanked and special attention was drawn to the work of the Kingswood School boys under Mr. Gardner.

Mr. Wedlake thanked Mr. Turvey for his co-operation during the Bath dig, and announced that he had offered to the Club the use of a room in his basement as Club Headquarters. This room would be open to members during the winter months on Wednesday evenings.

After thanking the members and officers of the Club for their help, Mr. Wedlake said that he was very sorry to announce the resignation of Miss Nancy Smith the Hon. Secretary, who was leaving Bath. She had done invaluable work for the Club since its inauguration.

The Treasurer's report showed a balance in hand of £7.16.1. This was adopted and a discussion followed on expenditure on the new Club room, Christmas Cards and Camertonia. It was agreed that under the present financial conditions we must be content with something less ambitious than the last edition.

Miss Melluish read the Excursions' report and Mrs. Parfitt the Survey and Research report.

The President and Vice-Presidents were re-elected with the addition of Mr. Turvey as a Vice-President.

Other Officers elected were Mr. Wedlake, Director of Excavations ; Hon. Sec. Mr. T.H. Cleworth ; Hon. Treasurer Miss B. Newman ; Hon. Excursion Sec. Miss D. Melluish ; Members of the Committee Mrs. Parfitt, Messrs. Gould, Moore and Vince.

Some alterations in some of the Rules of Membership were passed, and these alterations appear in the new edition of the Rules.
