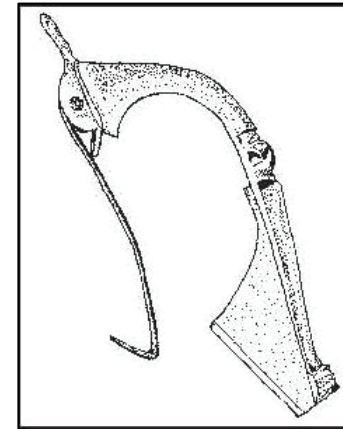

The society has initiated a long term research project to investigate the archaeology of the Lansdown plateau. The first of the identified sites has seen the completion of a geophysical survey. There are other similar events occurring throughout the summer. Past ones have included excavations at Keynsham and Saltford.

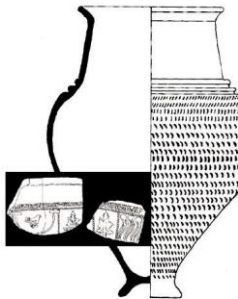
